Welcome to Grade 2/3!

In the classroom...

Term two will have focussing on asking questions whilst reading to better our comprehension and enjoyment we are funny, respectful and love coming to school! of books. We have a reading



ladder in our room that shows how much and how often we read. At home. have written and illustrated our own books, bringing them in to share and add to our class library. We shared our books with another grade last term and they will be placed in our school library so everyone can read and enjoy them. The value of reading, reading to others and writing our own stories is enormous.

In writing this term, we are focussing in on persuasive pieces.

Writing to convince others of our point of view. Creating arguments with evidence to support our writing. You can try this at home by discussing your own topic; A day at the beach is better than a day in the mountains, There should be more breaks during the school day, Which animal makes the best pet?

Chatting over dinner helps with our oral language and thinking processes.

We spent first looking at place value and patterns. This term, addition and subtraction is a major focus.

Games that we have played and you can play at home:

Salute. Three people. One person places a card on the foreheads of the other two players. Adding up the cards and calling out the answer, each player then tries to work out the value of the card on their own forehead.

Count to 45. Using a pack of cards, take out to use an Ace, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight and nine.

Set a timer and see how quickly you can add up the cards. Can you arrange the cards to make it quicker?


